<i>Introduction</i>
Develop your skills in a variety of jewellery making techniques and topics.
<i>What are the course entry requirements?</i>
Ideally you have attended other courses or had some experience of making jewellery, although beginners could attend.
<i>How long is the course?</i>

<i>What will the course involve?</i>
Followed simple instructions to make a variety of charm style and other jewellery learning a variety of different techniques. Working on individual projects. Sharing ideas with other learners
<i>How will I be learning?</i>
Following instructions and demonstrations as well as sharing ideas with peers. A variety of handouts will be available and learners will be encouraged to keep notes and ideas as they develop their skills.
<i>What equipment will I need?</i>
Please bring pen and paper for note taking, your tutor will also be providing some handouts. You will be encouraged to keep a file collect handouts, ideas and notes. There will be a small charge for the materials, components and beads that you use in class; you are welcome to bring and use your own materials, such as plated components, chain, wire and a selection of beads, this will be discussed in the first class. You will be given advice and guidance on where to buy your own materials
<i>How will I know if I am making progress?</i>
Your tutor will monitor your progress by carrying out an assessment at the start of the course and giving individual help and advice during each session. There will also be group discussion, question and answer and peer assessment as an ongoing part of the course.
